

Loren Horton Community History Award

Nomination Guidelines

The Loren Horton Community History Award recognizes the best project that increases awareness and participation in Iowa history on a local level. It is named in honor of Loren Horton, who represented the State Historical Society of Iowa in many capacities from 1973 until his retirement in 1996. As the Society's Field Services Coordinator, and later as senior historian, Horton's work brought him in close contact with many local historical organizations.

The award will recognize an individual, group, or organization whose outstanding local history project was completed during the prior calendar year. Nominated projects may incorporate any or all of the following categories:

- Outstanding program or even
- Outstanding use of volunteers
- Outstanding project related to a museum, library, archives, historic preservation or educational activity
- Outstanding research or publication
- Outstanding youth project

Several criteria will be used to select the award winner. Nominees shall have completed a local history project that:

- **Encourages collaboration and support from a cross-section of individuals and groups in the community**
- Increases awareness and appreciation for local or community history
- Promotes future interest in the history of the community and continues to generate enthusiasm and provides long-term protection of community history, whether tangible or intangible

One Loren Horton Community History Award is given annually. In addition to the overall award, one Certificate of Recognition may be presented in each of the categories.

State Historical Society of Iowa employees and Board of Trustees members are not eligible to receive the award.
