


# Innovative Iowans: Grenville Dodge

**Activity Overview:** Ready to crack some Goldie's secret codes? This Innovative Iowan focuses on Grenville Dodge's service during the Civil War, specifically his work with the "Corps of Scouts". In the activity, young historians will find hidden message by deciphering the secret questions on the Civil War Spies worksheet. Decode the messages, record your answers and become a master spy

#### Connection to Iowa History

Grenville Mellen Dodge settled in Council Bluffs, Iowa, and became a Union army officer and a pioneering figure in military intelligence. During the Civil War, Dodge led one of the largest intelligence gathering networks with over 100 agents (spies) for the Union Army under Ulysses S. Grant. The initial group included soldiers, unionists, female citizens and formerly-enslaved people in the Confederate territory. They were able to gather information by tapping telegraph wires and even intercepting mail.

Dodge was known for his tight operational security. For example, his spies corresponded by courier rather than telegraph and he would not share the names of his agents - even with Grant. Following the war, Dodge became the chief engineer of the Union Pacific Railroad and served one term in the United States Congress.



#### Instructions (Video Instructions Available)

- 1 Prep. Review the materials list and gather all the necessary items.
- 2 **Draw.** Draw a circle (3-4 inches wide) on a sheet of white paper.
- 3 **Cut.** Using scissors, carefully cut out the circle.
- 4 **Write.** With a pencil or pen, write the alphabet (A-Z) around the outer edge of the circle. The letters should wrap clockwise around the entire edge of the circle.
- **Learn the Code.** For this activity, each letter matches a different letter. In this worksheet a letter "I" is the letter "A" when decoded.
- **Write the Code.** Rotate the decorder so the letter "I" is at the top. Underneath the letter "I", write the letter "A" right below it. This will be the beginning of the inner circle of code.
- **Continue Writing.** Continue to rotate the decorder clockwise as you write the rest of the alphabet underneath the outside ring of letters. Each letter on the inner circle should line up with a different letter on the outer circle. For example, outer circle "J" will line up with the inner circle "B", "K" with "C", "L" with "D" and onward.
- 8 Worksheet. Once your decoder is finished, use it to break the codes in the provided worksheet.
- Create Code. After completing the worksheet, try your hand at creating your own codes. Use the same method to create your decorder except start at a different letter and write the alphabet clockwise.
