## How to Caucus 101

Activity Overview: Since 1972, lowans have gathered together in living rooms and school gymnasiums to voice their opinions regarding political candidates through a process called caucusing. This Innovative lowan activity focuses on the unique lowa caucus process and has young historians participating in their own mock caucus to select their favorite superheroes.

## Connection to lowa History

In 1972, Senator George McGovern gained national attention when he came out on top of the lowa caucuses. In 1975, candidate Jimmy Carter came in second place in the lowa caucuses. Carter used the momentum to become the Democratic Party's nominee, and eventually, the president of the United States. After that, the lowa caucus attracted national attention as candidates from both parties flocked to the state to make their case to lowa voters in local cafes, church basements, and similar venues. The winner of the lowa caucus doesn't always become the party's candidate, but a poor showing in lowa often leads candidates to withdraw.

## What is a Caucus?

A caucus is a meeting of people who are members of a political party, and they select representatives to important positions. These positions are called delegates. Not all political parties caucus the same way. In lowa, republicans use ballots. Democrats physically move their bodies in a room and a headcount is taken.

## Instructions (Video Instructions Available)

## Republican Mock Caucus

(1) Meet the Candidates. This mock caucus activity focuses on superheroes. The superhero candidates are: Batman, Black Panther, Captain America, Captain Marvel, Hulk, Spiderman and Wonder Woman
(2) Print and Cut. Before starting this activity, print the republican mock caucus ballots included in the attached worksheet. Cut out each ballot and set aside.
(3)

Select a Leader. Select someone to be the leader for this activity. This person will hand out, gather and count the ballots.

## Materials

- Pencil/Pen
- Iowa Caucus Worksheet
- Scissors
- Printer
(4) Vote. The leader will hand out a copy of the attached republican caucus ballot to everyone participating in the activity. Take a few moments for everyone to silently select their one preferred candidate on the paper. They will then fold the paper to cover their vote.

Collect. The person that handed out the ballots will then recollect the ballots.
6. Count the Votes. The leader will count the votes. Whichever candidate receives the most votes, wins the Republican caucus.

## Democratic Mock Caucus

(1) Meet the Candidates. This mock caucus activity focuses on superheroes. The superhero candidates are: Batman, Black Panther, Captain America, Captain Marvel, Hulk, Spiderman and Wonder Woman
2) Print. Before starting the activity, print the attached worksheet. The instructions for this activity are on the first two pages.
(3) Select a Leader. Select someone to be the leader for this activity. This person will complete the worksheet to assist with this activity.
(4) Select Delegates. Each caucus location is allotted a number of delegates. In order to make this activity work, you will need a group of 4 or more people. For this activity, your group has 4 delegates.
(5) Candidate Locations. Democratic caucuses require people to move around the room. Each candidate will require a space for supporters to gather during the moving time. Put up signs around the space with the candidates names so people know where to stand to support their candidate.

6 Move. After reviewing the candidate list, people will need to choose which superhero they like the best. Allow people 60 seconds to move to their favorite superhero's designated location in the room.
(7) Becoming Viable. Candidates require a certain number of people to remain "viable" to move to the second round. Use the attached worksheet to find what is viable for your group. Which superheroes are still viable for the second round? Which ones are not?

8 Support Your Candidate. Before beginning the second round, have each viable candidate group choose one spokesperson to speak about their candidate. Allow each candidate's spokesperson 60 seconds to try and convince others to join their group.

9 Second Round. The people that chose candidates that are not viable after the first round will need to move to a viable candidate during the second round. These people will have 60 seconds to join another viable group or they can create a super group with the other people who didn't have enough support. If you are in a group that is viable in the first round, you cannot move and switch candidates.
(10) Caucus Math. Using the attached worksheet, find out the number of delegates each superhero receives after the two rounds of caucusing.

- Do you think it is important to be the first state to choose and voice their choice? Why? Are there any drawbacks?
- Do you think lowa should remain first in the nation for selecting presidential candidates?

## Caucus Math Time

Following the second round, it is time to figure out how many of the 4 delegates each candidate will receive. Here is how to divide the delegates:

Total \# of delegates (4) x \# of people supporting that superhero DIVIDED BY
\# of total amount of people participating in caucus
Your answer will be the number of delegates that each superhero receives after caucusing.
