

"The Freedman's Bureau" Broadside, 1866

In this poster, an African-American man lounges idly in the foreground as one white man ploughs his field and another chops wood. Accompanying labels are: "In the sweat of thy face shalt thou eat thy bread," and "The white man must work to keep his children and pay his taxes." The African-American man wonders, "Whar is de use for me to work as long as dey make dese appropriations." Above in a cloud is an image of the "Freedman's Bureau! Negro Estimate of Freedom!" The bureau is pictured as a large-domed building resembling the U.S. Capitol and is inscribed "Freedom and No Work." Its columns and walls are labeled, "Candy," "Rum, Gin, Whiskey," "Sugar Plums," "Indolence," "White Women," "Apathy," "White Sugar," "Idleness," "Fish Balls," "Clams," "Stews" and "Pies." At right is a table giving figures for the funds appropriated by Congress to support the bureau and information on the inequity of the bounties received by black and white veterans of the Civil War.

Image of Freedman's Bureau: FREEDMAN'S BUREAU! NEGRO ESTIMATE OF FREEDOM!

Large-domed Building Inscription:

FREEDOM AND NO WORK.

Columns and Walls:

CANDY RUM, GIN, WHISKEY SUGAR PLUMS INDOLENCE WHITE WOMEN APATHY WHITE SUGAR IDLENESS FISH BALLS CLAMS STEWS PIES.

Right of Former Slave:

CONGRESS, IN JULY, 1866, VOTES THE NEGRO TROOPS \$300 Each as a Bounty The same CONGRESS, IN JUNE, 1866, VOTES THE WHITE VETERANS OF 1861 & 1862, \$100 Each as a Bounty

The NEGRO GETS \$300; the WHITE SOLDIER, \$200 is all - All of the WHITE soldiers served THREE years; [illegible] of the NEGROES over TWO Years.

Bottom of Broadside:

For 1864 and 1865, the FREEDMAN'S BUREAU cost the Tax-payers of the Nation, at least, TWENTY-FIVE MILLIONS OF DOLLARS. For 1866, THE SHARE of the Tax-payers of Pennsylvania will be about ONE [illegible] OF DOLLARS. GEARY is FOR the Freedman's Bureau. CLYMER is OPPOSED to it.
