

## Field Notes of Surveyor John Sullivan, 1816

Copy of the field notes of the survey of the old Indian boundary line from the 60<sup>th</sup> mile point north of the mouth of the river Kansas to the hundredth mile point, and old N.W. corner of the State of Missouri - thence East 150 miles and 40.00 chains to the right bank of the Des Moines River.

This line was run in 1816 and is commonly called the "Sullivan Line" under instructions from Wm Rector Surveyor General dated 23 July 1816 appointing said John C. Sullivan principal deputy to be assisted by Samuel C. Caldwell.

East 11.00	From the North West corner of the public lands, North of the Missouri river, and 100 miles North from the mouth of the River Kanzas along the mile No. 1. the prairie
80.00	set post, corner to mile No. 1, from which a W. oak 3 inches diam. (unreadable) S. 40° W. 104 lks.  a Lynn 10 " N. 84 E. 730 "  This mile poor broken barrens, timber Hales (unreadable)

East 15.00 26.00 59.50 80.00	along mile No. 2. a stream width 25 lks. runs S.E. prairie a stream width 25 lks. S.E. Timber along the banks of both streams set post, corner to mile NO. 2. from which a W. oak 10 inches diam. (unreadable) N. 18° W. 113 lks  A hickory 12 " " N. 21° W. 124 " This mile rich land, timber oak, Elm & Hickory.

East 80.00	Along mile No. 6. set post, corner to mile No. 6. From which a W. oak 15 inches diam. (unreadable) N. 27° W. 226 lks.  a W. oak 15 " " N. 45° W. 285" This mile broken 2nd rate prairie September 15th, 1816
