## Field Notes of Surveyor John Sullivan, 1816

Copy of the field notes of the survey of the old Indian boundary line from the $60^{\text {th }}$ mile point north of the mouth of the river Kansas to the hundredth mile point, and old N.W. corner of the State of Missouri - thence East 150 miles and 40.00 chains to the right bank of the Des Moines River.

This line was run in 1816 and is commonly called the "Sullivan Line" under instructions from Wm Rector Surveyor General dated 23 July 1816 appointing said John C. Sullivan principal deputy to be assisted by Samuel C. Caldwell.
