
## Rural Iowa at A Glance 2017 Edition

This bulletin summarizes current demographic, economic, and social trends in rural Iowa between 2006 and 2016. It is modeled after the United States Department of Agriculture's *Rural America at a Glance*. Current year data are presented along with changes from last year and five years ago. Data are reported for Iowa's metro, micropolitan, and rural areas. *Metropolitan* includes central counties with an urban center over 50,000 people, plus outlying suburbs linked by commuting patterns. *Micropolitan* counties have an urban center of at least 10,000 people, plus surrounding suburbs. *Rural* counties (technically noncore) have no urban center of 10,000 or more.






